HAWIIAN BREAD CHICKEN PARMESAN SLIDERS BAKE



INGREDIENTS:

- 24 ounces frozen breaded chicken tenders
- 1 package (12 ounces) Hawaiian sweet rolls
- 1 package (7-1/2 ounces) sliced provolone and mozzarella cheese blend
- 1 jar (24 ounces) Marinara Sauce
 TOPPING:
- 1/2 cup butter, cubed
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

DIRECTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 375°. Prepare chicken tenders according to package directions. Meanwhile, without separating rolls, cut horizontally in half; arrange roll bottoms in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Place half of cheese slices over roll bottoms. Bake until cheese is melted, 3-5 minutes.
- Layer rolls with half of sauce, chicken tenders, remaining sauce and remaining cheese slices. Replace top halves of rolls.
- For topping, microwave butter, garlic powder and red pepper flakes, covered, on high, stirring occasionally, until butter is melted. Pour over rolls; sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake, uncovered, until golden brown and heated through, 20-25minutes.





Walk+Bike CAMDEN! A Community Network Mapping Project



To make Camden a safer and more convenient place for walking and bicycling, the City of Camden is developing its first ever Active Transportation Network Vision Plan, called Walk+Bike CAMDEN! The Plan will outline a way to grow the network of bicycling and walking routes along City streets, sidewalks, and trails by filling in gaps and connecting neighborhoods to community services, parks, jobs, transit, and schools. The effort will build on current and planned bicycle and pedestrian networks like The Circuit Trails and the Camden County LINK Trail and other planning efforts like *The Camden Health Element* and the *Camden Parks and Open Space Plan*.

The City aims to understand the needs of Camden residents, business owners, and commuters who currently walk or bike, and those who <u>want</u> to walk or bike and currently do not do so. More than one-third of households in Camden do not have access to an automobile, and the combination of walking, biking, and transit can greatly expand access to services across and beyond the city. The Plan will position Camden to implement future sustainable and resilient transportation options and improve accessibility and mobility for all users of all ages and abilities.

The City invites the community to visit the project website, <u>www.walkbikecamden.com</u>, take the project survey (in English or in Spanish) and to share ideas for routes or destinations via an interactive map. Your comments will help the City understand barriers to travel and the places that residents most want to get to on foot or by bicycle.

Survey and mapping comments will be accepted online until December 31, 2021. The planning team will also be making appearances at neighborhood events throughout the city in November and December, holding mapping and visioning brainstorming sessions to share ideas. Print copies of the survey will be available on request for pick-up and drop-off locally.

This project is funded by a grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Bureau of Safety, Bicycle and Pedestrian Planning and is guided by a Steering Committee comprised of representatives from the City, Camden Community Partnership, Trust for Public Land, Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, Cross County Connection TMA, Tri-State Transportation Campaign, and the Bicycle Coalition of Greater Philadelphia.
